

and space to bask in the beauty of the season. Suggested donation is \$15.



"Theologically Speaking" Facilitated by Steven Moore Mondays beginning January 29th | 12:05 PM - 12:55 PM Hybrid

The Spiritual Renewal Center has a long tradition of engaging people in theological reflection. One of the earliest programs, "Not By Bread Alone" was a weekly meeting with presenters to gather people and present topics on theology. We are beginning a series that builds on our wonderful tradition titled, "Theologically Speaking" where we will engage in theological reflection. Theology is the study of God from the perspective of a believer. It is different from Religious Studies, which studies religions from a cultural perspective, or Apologetics which teaches



a person to defend religious doctrines. St. Anslem said that Theology is "faith seeking understanding." It is a practice that is not just for those in the academy or university **but is meant for every believer.**

Join Steve as we begin our study with The Nature of Theology by Roger Haight, SJ. This work will help us look at theology and how it impacts our lives. This series will be drop-in seminar style. There is no required registration and no set fee. You are welcome to come if you have read the book or are just interested in the topic. We are offering this hybrid during the lunch hour so you can attend either in person or via Zoom. Free will offering.

Join Steve in a guided reading of The Long Loneliness by Dorothy Day. This inspiring and fascinating memoir, subtitled, "The Autobiography of the Legendary Catholic Social Activist," The Long Loneliness is the late Dorothy Day's compelling autobiographical testament to her life of social activism and her spiritual pilgrimage. The Long Loneliness recounts her remarkable journey from the Greenwich Village political and literary scene of the 1920s through her conversion to Catholicism and her lifelong struggle to help bring about "the kind of society where it is easier to be good.". This Lent the Spiritual Renewal Center will be on the road at The Liverpool Catholic Community (Christ the King & Pope John XXIII Parish), and Immaculate Conception, Fayetteville. Praying with St. Ignatius of Loyola is a program based on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius.

The retreat at both locations is scripturebased and will provide an outline for spiritual growth. Each Wednesday evening in Lent, you will be guided through different methods of prayer, meditation, journaling, and small group faith sharing. Some have cited the benefits of the retreat as: a keener sense of God's will for them, a better understanding of Sunday Gospels, having more patience, and a deeper awareness of God acting in their lives.

Your commitment to the retreat is to attend weekly evening sessions on Wednesdays and set aside about 1/2 hour a day for private prayer.

Back by popular demand! This introduction to mindfulness training is based on skills from Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT). DBT mindfulness skills are specifically designed to be nondenominational and compatible with a wide variety of traditions and beliefs. This class will be especially helpful for people who are struggling with their spiritual practice, or emotional dysregulation or want to learn more about mindfulness for better health and well-being. The training will take place on Tuesdays from 10:30-12:00 pm at the Spiritual Renewal Center. Space is limited to 8 participants. This class is not a substitute for psychotherapy but may complement your current practice.

Steve Moore is the director of the Spiritual Renewal Center, spiritual director, and clinical psychologist. He was intensively trained in DBT and has conducted DBT groups in a variety of settings. We are not able to accommodate walk-ins. Suggested donation is \$25 per session.



The Ignatian Volunteer Corps (IVC) provides men and women, age 50 or above, opportunities to share their life skills and wisdom in service to our community's underserved. IVC members commit to volunteer 1-2 days weekly for 10 months per year. We meet monthly to prayerfully reflect on our service and deepen our Ignatian spirituality.
