Syracuse's Deputy Mayor, Sharon Owens will join us Thursday, November 9th, for the inaugural presentation on how faith informs one's role as a leader. In her current position of deputy mayor, Sharon Owens oversees city programs and services that address the quality of life in our community, including Neighborhood

and Business Development, and Parks, Recreation, and Youth Programs, as well as the Police and Fire Departments. Owens also serves as chief of staff to the mayor. She is a graduate of Syracuse University and is most proud of her role as wife to Shaun Owens and mother to Simone and Isaac.

Dr. Linda LeMura is a scientist and academic who is the current and 14th President of Le Moyne College. She is the first female layperson to be named as president of a Jesuit institution of higher education in the United States. Dr. LeMura earned a Ph.D. in Applied Physiology from Syracuse University and a B.S. summa cum laude from Niagara University.



At this retreat, we will be invited to explore biblical women in the Old Testament, focusing on Eve and Miriam in particular. These two women have often been overlooked and over-interpreted in their context and ours, and we will be revisiting them with fresh eyes, seeking to discover how they can enrich our faith lives. We will look at biblical texts, the history of their interpretation in Judaism and Christianity, and modern perspectives on these women from biblical studies, art, and culture. Our goal will be to come to a place where we can consider what these women might mean for our own spiritual lives—might they function as older sisters to us in the faith?

Celtic Spirituality talks about "thin places." These are sacred places where heaven meets earth, and we experience the sacred in an immediate way. I warn our spiritual directors that Tuesdays are busy at the Spiritual Renewal Center and you may not get a room if you just walk in. But Tuesdays are a "thin time" for us. A few weeks ago, I had the experience of standing in the entrance area of the Spiritual Renewal Center as people were coming in for all the different offerings. There were people there for our ongoing retreat on the 12



steps and the Spiritual Exercises. Others were meeting directors for the 19th annotation retreat, some were coming for regular spiritual direction, and a few others were browsing the library. We even had a meeting of folks who had connected during one of our previous programs from over a year ago who didn't want their retreat experience to end and still get together from time to time to catch up and offer support. For me, grace looks like people connecting to one another and sharing their spiritual lives.
