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






We will begin our new season of "Being One with God's Creation" with a powerful presentation by Rev. Stephen Blackmer, the founder and pastor of the Church of the Woods, a new kind of church on 106 acres of wild woods and wetlands in Canterbury, NH. Rooted in the Episcopal tradition, its congregation includes all life of the forest with the mission of loving, healing and blessing the Earth and each other! Participants seek to renew a widespread understanding of the natural world as sacred, and to restore this awareness as a foundation of both religious practice and practical action to conserve the Earth. Steve will be sharing how his journey of weaving ecology with spirituality has grown 'wild' in God's embrace!



Who was Jesus? A prophet? There have been many of those, A wise teacher? There have been many of those, too. In his latest book, renowned Scripture scholar Gerhard Lohfink asks, "What is unique about Jesus of Nazareth, and what did he really want?" Lohfink engages the perceptions of the first

witnesses of his life and ministry and those who handed on their testimonies. His approach is historical and critical, and he agrees with Karl Barth's statement that "historical criticism has to be more critical."

Lohfink takes seriously the fact that Jesus was a Jew and lived entirely in and out of Israel's faith experiences but at the same time brought those experiences to their goal and fulfillment. The result is a convincing and profound picture of Jesus.

Gerhard Lohfink (1934-2024), was a professor of NT exegesis at the University of Tubingen. This series will be drop-in seminar style. There is no required registration and no set fee. You are welcome to come if you have read the book or are just interested in the topic. We are offering this hybrid program during the lunch hour so you can attend either in person or via Zoom. Free will offering.



Wisdom Wednesdays: "The Living Flame of Love" by St. John of the Cross Beginning October 2 | 4:00-5:00 PM | *Hybrid* Facilitated by Steven Moore

Join Steve in a guided reading of "The Living Flame of Love" by St. John of the Cross. St. John of the Cross described the stanzas of his poem, The Living Flame of Love, as the "songs of the soul in the intimate communication of the union of love with God." The verses capture the mystical vistas from the summit of the saint's spiritual journey, describing the mystery and powerful experience of divine transformation as the soul

encounters and unites with the pure love of God. Our sessions will follow an informal seminar style as we engage in a close reading of the text. All are welcome! Free will offering.

The 12 Steps and the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola 6 Tuesdays, October 15 - November 19 | 3-4:30 PM | In Person

Drawing on materials from the Spiritual Exercises, the Big Book, the 12 & 12, and Scripture, this retreat **facilitated by Fr. Gerry McKeon** will explore themes of freedom from addictions, and encourage spiritual growth and private prayer or contemplation practices. 

Enneagram Practice Learning Group 7 Thursdays Sept 26 - Nov 7 3-4:30 PM | In Person

The Enneagram is an ancient symbol that has evolved as a dynamic tool for self-awareness and spiritual growth. These sessions offer an introduction to the three centers, body, heart and mind, and the 9 types. Each session will explore the process of the symbol as taught by various Enneagram practitioners, as well as practices to raise one's consciousness. Growing in selfawareness allows one to discover opportunities for healing while deepening one's vulnerability to be open to God's presence within. The group will be limited to 12 individuals. We will be using this book: "The Enneagram Guide to Waking Up" by Beatrice Chestnut, PhD and Uranio Paes, MM. Suggested Fee: \$15/each \$105 for the series Facilitated by Marge Babcock, Certified Enneagram Instructor & SRC Spiritual Director

Mary Oliver's poems have touched countless lives around the world, and can often be used when we can't come up with words of our own. Praying in Color is simply doodling with color as a way of helping to focus our wandering minds during prayer or meditation, and in particular when our own words are lacking. It's a simple and creative way to pray, meditate, or reflect. No previous experience or artistic skills are required! Art supplies will be provided! Suggested Fee: \$25

Nick will guide us through a conversation about things that sometimes block our expressions of prayer, and then use some materials from the *Praying in Color* books by Sybil Macbeth to guide us through a few creative exercises to help us pray more creatively and open our hearts to the movement of the Spirit as we read some of Mary Oliver's poetry!




