The Journey From Reformation to Transformation:
The 12 Steps and the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola (Hybrid)
Tuesdays, October 17-November 21 | 10:30 am-12 noon EST
Presented by Rev. Gerry McKeon, S.J.

During six Tuesdays we will explore 12 Step Spirituality from the perspective of the Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius of Loyola. We will gather from 10:30 - Noon for input and conversation. Each week we will explore dynamics from the Spiritual Exercises which shed light upon the wisdom of 12-Step Spirituality, so relevant for our age. We will address the call to become freed from our addictions, and freed for a life of loving service, walking with the Risen Christ. This spiritual journey will also allow time for daily private prayer with suggested meditations and contemplations. Participants will have an opportunity to share graces from their prayer during the weekly group gatherings. Fee: \$25 per session, or whatever you can afford.

Fr. Gerry McKeon, S.J. lives in the Jesuit Community at Le Moyne College in Syracuse, New York. He is a member of the staff at the Spiritual Renewal Center in Syracuse, where he offers Spiritual Direction, and Retreats in Everyday Life based on the Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius of Loyola. He also serves as a visiting Retreat Director at Eastern Point Retreat House, Gloucester, MA. His other ministry includes Chaplaincy at Syracuse hospitals, and at a local county jail. On the weekends, he assists at a local Catholic Parish.


IVC of Syracuse is accepting applications to join our service ministry

DBT Mindfulness Skills Training (in-person only) Eight Mondays, beginning September 18 6:30-8:00 pm EST

Back by popular demand! This introduction to mindfulness training is based on skills from Dialectical Behavioral Therapy

(DBT). DBT mindfulness skills are specifically designed to be nondenominational and compatible with a wide variety of traditions and beliefs. This class will be especially helpful for people who are struggling with their own spiritual practice, or emotional dysregulation, or want to learn



more about mindfulness for better health and well-being. The training will take place on Mondays from 6:30-8 pm at the Spiritual Renewal Center. Space is limited to 8 participants. This class is not a substitute for psychotherapy but may complement your current practice. We are not able to accommodate walk-ins. Fee is \$25 per session.

Steve Moore is the director of the Spiritual Renewal Center, spiritual director, and clinical psychologist. He was intensively trained in DBT and has conducted DBT groups in a variety of settings. If you are interested, please contact Steve at the Spiritual Renewal Center.

What Does Grace Look Like? is a series of reflections about God's grace. This issue's grace story comes from the Rev. Dr. Steven Moore, Center Director.

What Does Grace Look Like?

Sometimes Grace becomes clear not in the events of our lives but in the way we tell the story. Early in my formation, I was a pastoral visitor at Loretto Nursing Home. In my rounds I would visit two women with similar backgrounds. Both had grown up in Syracuse and worked hard their whole lives. The difference is one was married and the other had remained single. When they were at Loretto, the first woman was sad and complained every day because she was now in the nursing home for rehab, despite the fact that her husband and son visited her everyday.



The other woman, Anna, did not have daily visitors but was so grateful for everything the staff did for her, and would be excited to see her niece a couple of times a year. She had lived a difficult life working as a seamstress, but the way she spoke about her life and God's mercy would make you think that she had lived an easy life. I learned early on that our ability to recognize grace is not primarily about our experience, but what we focus on and how we tell the story.
